On November 13, 1990, the stallion, ALYDAR, kicked his stall door with his right hind leg and suffered a mid-shaft transverse fracture of the cannon bone. The fracture was immobilized overnight with the use of a cast and the horse's shock was reversed.

On November 14, 1990, ALYDAR's fracture was surgically reduced by Dr. William A. Baker and Dr. Larry Bramlage. The fracture was stabilized with the use of a bone graft, plate, pins and a fiberglass cast. Although the fracture was adequately repaired, ALYDAR's prognosis is considered guarded. If no complications develop, the horse should be able to stand the 1991 breeding season.

A representative from Dixon Adjusters was present throughout the procedure.
